It is designed to support providers and staff to exercise their statutory and professional duties to safeguard vulnerable adults, children and young people at risk of radicalisation. Examples based on real cases and flowchart diagrams have been developed for the guidance to illustrate Prevent in a mental health context. It builds on a range of existing guidance and advice on safeguarding and information sharing in the health sector, as well as guidance on the Prevent Duty and Channel programme.

Childline Annual Review 2016/17: Not alone anymore. This report from the NSPCC explores what children and young people are telling Childline during counselling sessions. It looks at who is contacting Childline, why, when and how. It focuses on 3 key areas: anxiety; suicidal thoughts and feelings; what children who are d/Deaf, disabled or have a health condition are talking to Childline about. It also highlights strategies that young people tell Childline they find helpful when coping with challenges.
